

WeTHRIVE! Ambassadors

Program Overview

Hamilton County Public Health (HCPH) created the WeTHRIVE! Ambassador Program to engage community members to become ambassadors of sustainable community-level change within Hamilton County. Community members play an important role in improving the health, safety, and vitality of the community as well as helping to sustain the WeTHRIVE! initiative. HCPH will provide support to Ambassadors through ongoing training, technical assistance, and making connections to WeTHRIVE! Teams and other Ambassadors.

WeTHRIVE! Ambassador requirements—

- Attend the WeTHRIVE! Ambassador Overview Training (4 hours)
- Attend at least one (1) additional pathway- or topic-specific training per year
- Complete a Pledge Card outlining support for the WeTHRIVE! initiative
- Connect with a community WeTHRIVE! Team, or help HCPH and the community form a team if one does not exist.

Training—

The Ambassador Overview Training was developed as hands-on training that allows new Ambassadors to practice skills and learn from others during the training. HCPH will offer the Ambassador Training at least twice a year; a combination of Saturday and evening trainings will be available. The WeTHRIVE! Ambassador Overview Training topics include:

- WeTHRIVE! Initiative Overview
- Public Health / Population Health
- Health Equity
- Policy, System, and Environmental Change Strategies
- Message Development

HCPH will offer additional pathway- and topic-specific trainings throughout the year to build the Ambassador's knowledge and skills. Training topics may include:

- Personal Preparedness
- Using Data to Develop Action Plans
- Safe Routes to School
- Building Diverse Teams
- Social Determinants of Health
